A Thought

Today, Sunday, we are celebrating the Solemnity of the Ascension of Our Lord into Heaven. Formerly (and still in other parts of the Catholic World), this was celebrated on the 40th day after Easter, a Thursday, on which day, as today's reading from Acts reminds us, Our Lord took leave, so to speak, of His Apostles. His physical departure may still be symbolised at Mass that day in the extinguishing of the paschal Candle (symbol of the Risen Christ) following the Gospel.

Jesus had, of course, promised to be with His Church always and, in order to do this, He and the Father were to send the Holy Spirit at Pentecost (again, a numerical association, from the Greek word for 50, .i.e. the number of Days after Easter that the Spirit came) to transform those timid Bishops and Priests into fearless crusaders for the Truth. They were Confirmed or 'energised' as it were, to ".. Go out to the whole world...", come what may, to proclaim the Good News that Christ is, indeed, Risen and that, through His Body, the Church, with her Priests and Her seven Sacraments, we have a sure and infallible link to our God and our Heavenly destiny. Only our determined refusal can, ultimately. deprive us of the Life promised to us.

In France and Germany, among other countries, the day is a Public Holiday, an echo of the deep Catholic Faith of former times. When England acknowledged herself as the Dowry of Mary, 'Holy-days' were, very often, the only extra days off, especially, probably, for the poor – from this, of course, comes our word, holiday. Let us resolve to specially mark this day in our families, helping not only our children but, also, those of other faiths we may know, to see the wonder of this day.
