AN IMPORTANT NOTICE FROM OUR PARISH SAFEGUARDING OFFICER:

Dear parishioners,

I wanted to bring to your attention the importance of safeguarding being our collective responsibility. It is imperative as a community we do not perceive safeguarding to be solely a matter that is the business of the police or social services. All of us have a role to play in the protection of children and vulnerable adults, specifically within our church and more widely in the community. It is through our collective diligence and being actively curious about these matters, that any concerns raised, can be dealt with robustly. The expectation of the diocese is for parents to ensure they are monitoring and supervising their children at all times. Children should never be left unsupervised in any areas of the church. Carers of vulnerable adults will also need to ensure that adequate supports are put in place. My intention in raising this issue is not to cause fear or anxiety, but is rather a reminder of the importance for us all to take on the responsibility of safeguarding within our community. We must all take this matter very seriously.

I would ask that if at any time anyone has any concerns, however small they may seem, please do not hesitate to contact me. This will enable us to have a conversation so that a decision can be made with regard to an appropriate response, ensuring that matters do not drift. You are also within your rights to contact the police or social services in addition to speaking with me directly, if you so wish. I am more than happy to support anyone who may wish to contact statutory services. I have worked for thirteen years within a statutory context, (Children's Services and the NHS) managing child protection matters. I am a qualified social worker and systemic psychotherapist.
