#### **Gift Aid givers:**


For MISSIO, Gift Aid is collected centrally, using their own envelopes. so please <u>do not</u> use an envelope from your box.

## A further thought on the Month of the Holy Rosary



As we say the Rosary we can unite ourselves with our Brothers and Sisters around the world, both those who, like us, are free to publicly profess their Faith and those who, as the news constantly portrays, are being persecuted, sometimes martyred for their Faith, the tragedy being deepened by the fact that the persecutors appear to believe that they do these things in God's Name!
