GIFT AID 2017/2018

"Money Sunday" - 18th / 19th March 2017

This is a very important message for all those who make their weekly offering to the Church by Gift Aid.

We shall be issuing new boxes of Gift Aid envelopes from next weekend, $18^{th} / 19^{th}$ March 2017, which will come into use on $8^{th} / 9^{th}$ April 2017, which is the first weekend of the new Financial Year. This is so that we come into alignment with the Diocesan accounting system.

Therefore, from 8th / 9th April it is essential that you <u>destroy</u> <u>all remaining old envelopes from previous years</u>, including the "salmon" pink ones issued to you last May. Under HMRC rules, only the new envelopes may be used. The new main collection envelopes are pink, whilst those for second collections are blue. Only these envelopes will be accepted by HMRC in order to be eligible for Gift Aid. This means that any other envelopes used after this date, <u>except for the larger sized</u> "<u>emergency</u>" <u>enevelopes</u>, will not qualify, and their contents will go into the non - Gift Aided monies in the collection.

IMPORTANT: If your current envelope number is between 326 and 410 inclusive, you will be allocated a new number. This is to help us reduce the number of boxes of envelopes required, and reduce costs. If you fall within this range of numbers, and you make your offering by Standing Order, your current envelope number may show in your Standing Order Instructions to your bank. However, you will not need to advise your bank, as we can handle the conversion process ourselves.

NB: Gift Aid envelopes are specific to the person who has signed the declaration form. The envelopes are not transferrable – even to other members of the same family.
