A Thought

Time flies! Christmas is over and Lent is upon us! Jesus warned people about the shortness of earthly life, and eternal destiny, urging constant preparation for our coming before God, death coming "...like a thief in the night...you know not the day nor the hour..." The Liturgy of Ash Wednesday reminds us that "... *you are dust, and to dust you will return.*" Sadly this world, sees wealth, celebrity and power as signs of a fulfilled life, though these can separate us from God. The world can be very unforgiving, but Christ, knowing our fallen Nature, gives us a period of the year dedicated especially to examination of conscience, trying to see ourselves as God sees us. Of course, Lent must, *not* be our sole spiritual 'MOT' for the year. The Good Shepherd, is always calling us home, welcoming our return, particularly through the Sacrament of Reconciliation, available daily, if needed, in addition to scheduled times. It takes courage and humility to go to Confession. Sadly we often falsely attribute our sometimes unforgiving nature to Christ. The Scriptures are full of accounts of Jesus forgiving people, e.g.: the woman taken in adultery and the "good" thief at Calvary. Jesus' many physical cures point towards His ability, as God, to heal our spiritual ills, i.e. sins. He never turns penitents away. Forgiveness requires sorrow, and a resolve not to sin again. How often do we hear Christ say: "*Go and sin no more*"? Why not plan to make a good Confession, and thereafter regular Confessions in 2015, just as we have regular medical check-ups, rather than await a major, possibly fatal illness. Remember, Confession is *NOT* just for Mortal Sins. Every Confession brings Grace, strengthening our closeness to God. Our priests can answer our questions, however 'silly' we might think them; nothing shocks them; they are glad to continue the work for which they were ordained. There are many books on the subject: "*Confession, A little Book for the Reluctant*" by Mgr. LG de Ségur, (TAN), answers many of the groundless fears that many, sadly, have of this Sacrament.
