A Thought

"Amen", a seemingly insignificant word, yet, said prayerfully, a word which speaks volumes. Our Lord, emphasising a Truth, is recorded at times, saying, "Amen, Amen, I say to you..." How many times do we say Amen during the Mass, apart from in our daily Prayers? One might sometimes believe that the word has been deleted from the end of the 'Our Father', when said outside Mass, however, reading the *In Brief* section of the Catechism of the Catholic Church (2857-2865) shows that, far from being 'tacked on' to the end of this prayer, just how significant the 'Amen' is. 2865: By the final "Amen," we express our "fiat" concerning the seven petitions: "So be it.". In a way it puts the 'seal' on the words of this and many other prayers. "Yes, I believe", is another meaning of this word. There is also a clear explanation of this on Catholic Answers:-

Maybe we all need, from time to time, to study, anew, in detail, this and other prayers which, perhaps, familiarity can cause to be said without a lot of thought. How many other commonplace words might surprise us with their significance?
